Life Care Memory Partners is part of the larger organization, Lower Cape Fear Life Care, which also offers Hospice Care, Palliative Medicine, Grief Care and Community Education. Candy was joined by three of her associates who were available to answer questions and distribute assorted print materials for residents to peruse at home. Life Care Memory Partners is one of the local non-profits that ORCA supports though fundraising.
